Community Environment for Young Kids



Become Part of a **Canadian Family**

The Comox Valley International Student Program is very proud of our internally run Homestay Program. Our dedi-cated Homestay Coordinators carefully screen each of our homestay families. Before you arrive, we provide homestay families with a thorough orientation to ensure you are always safe and well cared for. Our Homestay Coordinators are available to assist you and homestay families. They will maintain active communication throughout your time in our program.

Our Homestay Program is open to students above age 12. For all the students who are part of our Homestay, the Comox Valley School District will provide free custodianship. If students are under 12 years old, they will need to be accompanied by their parent(s) and the parent(s) will be the custodian while they are in Canada.





You'll be treated like 'part of the family' and can expect:

- Three meals per day plus snacks
- A private room and access to all amenities in the home
- · Participation in family events and holidays
- Your homestay parents to advocate for you with your school
- Assistance with personal banking, SIM card, homework, activity sign-ups, and completing school forms
- Access to medical or dental care if required
- Transportation to activities outside of school hours
