

Local lakes, rivers and ocean tours

Mt. Washington Chair Lift

Students will ride the chair lift to the spectacular Alpine Meadows where they can view the Pacific Ocean in the distance

Courtenay Museum

Features exhibits of Pioneer history, First Nations exhibits and 80,000,000 year old fossil and dinosaur displays. Museum scientists take students on a trek to the River where everyone gets a chance to dig for their own fossils.

Miracle Beach

A BC Provincial Park with an outstanding sandy beach, warm water for swimming and beachcombing.

Campbell River Discovery Pier

Students can get their fishing license and try their luck at Westcoast fishing.

Cumberland Museum

Celebrates the rich coal mining and dynamic labour history of the Chinese and Japanese workers who came to Canada to seek their fortune. The museum sponsors a heritage walking tour, which shows how these new Canadians contributed to the development of the local community and economy.

Komoux First Nations I-Hos Gallery

Offers guests an authentic First Nations experience through art and traditional buildings.

Victoria

BC's capitol city boasts our house of Parliament, the Royal BC Museum, and a downtown harbour front filled with buskers ready to delight. Beacon Hill Park is a great place to relax while catching an ocean view. Visit the Petting Zoo for a cuddle with a goat.

Vancouver

BC's biggest city. See Stanley Park, shop the famous Robson street, go for a swim in an ocean side pool, catch a Whitecaps game, and "Fly Over Canada".

Tribune Bay Outdoor Education Centre
